My name is John James. My parents are currently missionaries in Sri Lanka. Born in Minnesota where my dad's first parish was, I moved with my family to Michigan when I was about 6 years old. I was homeschooled through High School, though I took many online, dual-enrollment, and community college classes. I also started cello lessons and played in the Battle Creek Youth Orchestra. I

My senior year of High School my dad received a call from international missions to become a missionary in Sri Lanka. I have been blessed greatly by this experience to see the Truth of the Gospel held dear and fostered by the faithful around the world. My brother and I always enjoy returning to Sri Lanka for Christmas breaks.

While in India, I began learning Greek through an online class. I am now enrolled at Hillsdale College as a Classics Major, studying both Greek and Latin. This year, I am leading a spoken Greek group with the Active Classical Languages Club on campus, and student teaching Latin at a local school. I have kept up my musical instruments, playing cello in the College Symphony Orchestra and a student chamber music group called Camarata. I also play as a banjo for hire for student bands. I've served on the board of the young student group, The Lutheran Society, helping to get it to be a sustainable club. We have evening prayer every school night, provide rides to church, and bring in outside speakers to lecture on campus.
