

Steinbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund

The **Steinbeck Memorial Scholarship Fund** was established in 1970 following the death of Verna (Mrs. Karl) Steinbeck. Verna was Mission Hospice Chairman of the LWML CNH for 23 years, serving as host to missionaries and their families as they passed through the San Francisco area on their way to and from foreign mission fields. The **Steinbeck Memorial Fund** is specifically designed to assist in furthering the education of the children of overseas missionaries. Recipients must be high school seniors or older and must plan to attend an institution of higher education of their choosing. Each applicant must provide grade transcript, a brief autobiographical sketch and statement of goals.

The LWML CNH Human Care Committee vets the recipients and the BOD administers the funds. Money for this fund comes from love gifts, LWML CNH convention offerings and interest from Lutheran Church Extension Funds (LCEF) notes.

LWML CNH Endowment Fund

The **LWML CNH Endowment Fund** was created in May 1993 to generate income to provide funding for ministry. The income generated from this growing endowment funds inward and outreach ministries. The Endowment Fund continues to grow with personal gifts from LWML members. This gift may be a direct immediate gift, a gift from your Christian Estate Plan, or other gift options.

Rubin Perpetual Memorial fund

The **Rubin Perpetual Memorial Fund** was established in 1968. Rev. Alwin L. Rubin was a staunch supporter of LWML from its inception. He served as LWML counselor on both the district and international levels for nearly 25 years and was instrumental in establishing the Christian Growth program. He served as pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Walnut Creek, California, from 1953 until his death in 1968. Pastor Rubin's prime interest was in assisting in the education and development of full-time church workers. Thus, the fund was established to provide financial aid to students from the CNH District intending to enter full-time church work.

The LWML CNH sends money to this fund every two years which is gathered from love gifts, LWML CNH conventions offerings and interest from our LCEF notes.

Mite Offerings for Mission Grants

Throughout the decades, Lutheran Women have stepped out in faith, setting goals and trusting God to move the hearts of His people to give generously to LWML to proclaim the Gospel.

Mites are freely given offerings by individuals/groups/zones for the purpose of reaching out to others through mission projects for our districts as well as all over the world to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Districts retain 75% of the mite offerings for the work of the LWML at that Level. 25% goes to the National mites which fund over \$2 million in grants.
