### You Look Like Your Father

I have been told most of my adult life how much I resemble my mother. My uncles have even told me that I sound just like her. I always thought I looked more like my father because I was more like him. But, one day recently, I looked in the mirror and realized everyone had been right all along – I do look like my mother. A family resemblance can be comforting. It provides visual confirmation that we belong; we are part of the group.

As Christians we are made in God's image. When God created man, He made him in the likeness of God (Genesis 5:1b). We are His children, redeemed and transformed through the death and resurrection of Christ. By the power of the Holy Spirit, when we take the focus off ourselves and reach out to others in love and kindness, we reflect the love and kindness of Jesus. We show people a glimpse of our heavenly Father.

During Christ's time on earth, He touched the lives of people of all ages, beliefs, and ways of life. He loved people. He did not care about their social standing. He cared about their needs as He cared for them physically and spiritually.

Ephesians 2:10 states that we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. In Matthew 25 Jesus tells us that when we visit prisoners, feed the hungry, care for the sick, and welcome the stranger we are serving Him.

- Visit at a retirement home?
- Make cookies for VBS?
- Sing in the choir?
- Help in the church office?
- Be a good listener?
- Serve on the Altar Guild?
- Plan an event?

Use the gifts and talents God has given you to care for others. But do not get stuck in a rut or reject a new area of service because it is not an area for which you feel equipped or even worked before. God does not ask if we are capable, only if we are willing. He promises to always be with us and to give us what we need to serve Him.

Our faithful prayers and mighty mites allow us to make a difference in the lives of people in our communities and around the world. We care for them physically and spiritually, just as Christ has taught us.

Can people see the love of Christ through you? Be a Lutheran Woman in Mission, sharing God's love and compassion with a hurting and needy world.
