MESSAGE FROM VICE PRESIDENT CHRISTIAN LIFE

The 2023 Retreat, *Unwrapping Your Spiritual Gifts*, was held at ECCO Conference Grounds, Oakhurst, CA, the weekend of August 25, 26, & 27. The attendance totaled 95 — 91 women and four men, including three pastors and a Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) employee.

During the busy weekend, ladies met a prayer partner, took part in a Bible study led by Michelle Ule, sang encouraging songs led by Melody Hues, glorified God in devotions led by Pastor David Floyd and Pastor Colter Knippa, took part in hands-on service projects, and were well entertained by a classic variety-type talent show! We ended the weekend with a worship service featuring communion.

Retreat highlights: Service projects, mite collection & donations for Emmanuel Lutheran Church and School in Maui

The attendees enjoyed making braille and large print books under the guidance of three LBW workers. They folded, labeled, and put mailing stickers on 400 large print sermons, pressed and completed 14 twenty-page books and 11 thirty-five-page books for a total 665 pages or twenty-five books! A free-will offering provided a donation of \$258. Other attendees colored greeting cards to be used by Phil's Friends to cheer cancer patients. This activity produced 70 cards for the project! A donation of \$220 was collected.

Mites were collected to specifically fund the CNH Grant projects. Barbara Guevara knit a table full of beautiful scarves and hats, donating the \$240 proceeds to the Mite Box. Our speaker, Michelle, stocked a table of her books for sale at \$10 each and donated the \$170 proceeds to CNH Mites. The Mite box donations and the worship service offerings accounted for another \$1,269.05.

The fires on Maui were on everyone's minds as we collected money to help Emmanuel Lutheran Church and School in Kahului fund scholarships for displaced students from Lahaina. \$2,383 was collected, including \$400 donated by Linda Patel from the sale of several of her Indian costumes.

Several new and fun activities at this retreat:

- All attendees received a small purple gift box filled with fun little items including a Bible verse bracelet (courtesy of a Thrivent grant)
- Bottles of bubbles for all first timers! (also from the Thrivent grant)
- Pastor's wives in attendance received a lovely Luther Rose pewter cross necklace
- A talent show that must be seen to be believed

My deepest thanks to my entire committee:

Judy Huber, Laura Lynn Ledson, Margaret Peterman, and Christa Hamilton, registrar extraordinaire. My prayer is that all in attendance received a blessing from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and that God was glorified by our activities! •

Grant #8: Mighty mites go to Concordia Seminary, St. Louis

Our LWML CNH mites, all \$10,000, Grant #8, Scholarships for International Seminary Student at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, was presented at a special luncheon September 18, 2023. The day began when greeters from Gift Planning and Donor Services received the real check, then off to Chapel service, a VIP campus tour by Past President Dale Meyers, viewing of the J.S. Bach Bible, Presidents reception/luncheon presentation, concluding with a student tour/interview and special trip up the Luther tower to see the carillon belles—a full day that confirmed our mites grant to the seminary was a wise investment.

If you are thinking of taking the kids/grandkids to a Disneyland-type vacation, consider Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. Hear the voices during chapel, soak in the rays from the stain glass windows, and listen to the students and professors talk with passion of LCMS history with plans for the future spreading of the gospel. A meal in the dining hall is a must. The building tells of the rich history of this most special LCMS treasure. I urge you to experience the Seminary for yourself; tell them Bev sent you!

Update: Grant #17 (2020-2022 biennium)

As you may recall we sent \$3,500 in mites in the 2020-22 biennium grants to Lutheran Lambs Pre-School for curriculum resources. In March of 1982 the Valley of Peace was created as a refugee community for immigrants fleeing from the Salvadoran Civil War to Belize. The children have difficulty acquiring the skills needed to succeed in school. Missionary Pastor Herb Burch and his wife, Markie, opened a preschool to meet this need and share the gospel.
